## From the Principal

#### The Assumption - Thursday 15 August

This Thursday, 15 August, is the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary and is a Holy Day of Obligation. The Feast of the Assumption commemorates Mary's entrance into Heaven, body and soul, and as a College community we will commemorate the feast day with a whole school Mass. It is what we Catholics call a Holy Day of Obligation,

and Father Olek clarified the nature of this observance well in last Sunday's parish bulletin:

'Holy Days of Obligation' are special occasions on which Catholics are obliged to attend Mass. "On Sundays and other holy days of obligation, the faithful are to refrain from engaging in work or activities that hinder the worship owed to God, the joy proper to the Lord's Day, the performance of the works of mercy, and the appropriate relaxation of mind and body" (Catechism of the Catholic Church 2185).

Aside from every Sunday of the year, there are two "Holy Days of Obligation" in Australia. These are Christmas Day (25 December) and the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (15 August).

Pope Benedict XVI spoke beautifully of the Assumption of Mary in the following manner when he stated that "While she lived on this earth, Mary could only be close to a few people. Being in God, who is close to us, actually, "within" all of us, Mary shares in this closeness of God. Being in God and with God, she is close to each one of us, knows our hearts, can hear our prayers, can help us with her motherly kindness and has been given to us, as the Lord said, precisely as a "mother" to whom we can turn at every moment."

May we turn to Mary who is close to us and receive from her, Jesus her son, the bread of life."

#### Vinnies Day - Friday 16 August

Vinnies Day will take place on Friday 16 August. Students from Early Learning to Year 12 are encouraged to wear comfy casual clothes and donate gold coins which will go directly to the Winter Appeal. To assist in helping you discern donations:

Junior School: Please donate a non-perishable food item for Vinnies. Alternatively, families could donate winter essentials such as new: warm pj's, socks or undergarments.

Early Learning and Community Centre and Middle School: Please donate a non-perishable food item for Vinnies, such as canned Harvest meals, soup, veggies, tuna, or baked beans, long life milk, spaghetti, or pasta.

Senior School: Please donate a toiletry item for Vinnies. Example: shampoo, conditioner, body wash, face cleanser, tooth brush, or tooth paste

#### The Vinnies Winter Sleepout - Year 11 and 12 - Friday 16 August

The Vinnies Winter Sleepout for Year 11 and 12 students will take place on Friday 16 August. This optional event, which currently has over thirty participants, aims to raise vital funds for the most vulnerable people in our communities. Those attending the Sleepout will swap their usual cosy beds and food choices for a night without the comforts of home. By choosing to do this they are experiencing, for just one night, a small part of what those facing disadvantage suffer every day. Additionally, students, and staff, who are not able to stay the night may choose to live without all their usual comforts and donate what they would have spent.

Students are encouraged to register their interest for this event via the Forms link in the SEQTA Notices and then set their own fundraising goals.

#### **CESA Community LLL Perception Surveys**

By the conclusion of Week 5 of Term 3 all Catholic Schools in South Australia will complete the CESA Living, Learning, Leading Perception Surveys. The surveys are a product of a collaboration between Catholic Education SA (CESA) and Curtin University and are focussed on the development, validation and use of a system-wide survey to examine the understanding of the vision and extent to which Catholic Education SA's Living Learning Leading Framework is taking place in schools as perceived by students, family and staff.

Each survey has been trialled, refined and piloted in a range of CESA school settings and the development team is confident that schools will derive very useful information for planning and improvement.

#### Reception enrolments 2025

I advise parents and caregivers that interviews are well under way for all 2025 Reception Enrolments. We invite parents or caregivers and students to schedule an interview time with Mrs Francesca Dickson, Head of Junior School, to formalise their child's enrolment for 2025. If you have a child who is due to start school in 2025 and have not received a letter, please contact Enrolment Registrar Tracey Davey on 08 8725 5455 who will help you organise this.

#### Student Exemption Form required for absences over 5 days.

If your child will be absent from school for more than 5 days, please ensure that you contact the Administration Office to obtain a Student Exemption Form. All absenteeism for more than 5 days is approved by the College Principal and entered into our Attendance system to ensure accurate records are maintained and family's government benefits and allowances are protected.

#### **School Crossing Reminders**

I remind parents about the 25kmph speed limit through the School Crossing when the lights are flashing or at any time when children are present.

Crossing monitors are on duty from 8:20am – 8:40am in the morning and from 3:10pm – 3:30pm in the afternoon to cross children safely. If a parent or child pedestrian is stopped there, waiting to cross, even before the crossing monitors have arrived please stop and allow them to cross.

Please note that it is a legal obligation for drivers at the crossing when the lights are flashing and it is not attended by crossing guards:

- 25kmh must be attained BEFORE the 25 sign, and the drivers must STOP when adults OR children have stood at the side to try and cross.
- Speed must NOT be increased until AFTER the 50kmh sign.

As per legislation, you are also asked not to obstruct the crossing, whilst waiting in a line-up of traffic.

We are looking at measures with the City of Mount Gambier to minimise the congestion in and around our carparks, but I ask for your cooperation, presence and patience during these challenging winter weeks.

#### Wellbeing Initiative - Classroom Pulse 'Check-In'

As in past years, each term this year during week 5 and 6 every student in a Catholic School in South Australia will participate in a simple online Classroom Pulse Check-In. This Check-In has been developed to ascertain how students are currently feeling about their experience in school. It is tailored to allow your child's teacher(s) to Check-In and provide immediate feedback and support to them. The Check-In will be carried out during the school day.


the Blessed Virgin Mary which is a holy day of obligation for Catholics.


