

It was a difficult challenge against Prince Alfred College in the semi-final PAC opened a double digit first half lead utilising their talent and size advantage. In the third quarter our boys showed great fight to eradicate a 16-point lead and draw within 2 points at three quarter time. However, the energy expended to come back left the group running on empty and PAC ran out victors with the final score of 68-55

Embodying traditional Tenison spirit, our boys bounced back in the 3rd place playoff demonstrating excellent defensive toughness to quell the size and talent of Sacred Heart. Stingy defence led to quality offensive opportunities and an improved shooting performance resulting in a 73-67 win.

From High-Achieving Student And Teacher to Editor



Tenison Woods College Italian Language Teacher, Giovanni Calandro, has enjoyed the benefits of three years of work, study, and conversations with colleagues from five continents about Extensive Processing Instruction (EPI) and its implementation in everyday second language teaching.

From the first webinar with Dr. Gianfranco Conti, Giovanni understood the importance of research-based teaching and inquiry. For Giovanni "teaching is an ongoing craft that can't be crystallised; it requires continuous study, passion, dedication, and energy."

Starting as a student, Giovanni volunteered for the role of proofreader, and eventually due to his linguistic proficiency he was asked by Dylan Vinales (co-author of the Language Gym series and co-creator of EPI) to become the editor of a book by Dr. Gianfranco Conti and Dylan Vinales themselves, part of a series published internationally with Dr Christian G. Moretti-Byrnes as author.

The release of the book coincided with Giovanni receiving a certificate with distinction from Bath Spa University's School of Education and Network for

Languages. This certification took a year to complete, covering six modules and a final assessment.

Giovanni looks forward to sharing his findings with colleagues and to become an accredited EPI trainer in 2025, further promoting second language acquisition in Australian schools.

Principal, David Mezinec, indicated "It is no surprise to those who work with Giovanni, that his work has resulted in study of distinction and being asked to edit the languages text. Giovanni is a highly talented linguist who seeks every opportunity to refine his craft so that our young have the best possible opportunities."
