I was delighted to meet with Travis Webster-Lawson, Year 10 student serving as a local representative on the South Australian Student Representative Council

(SA SRC). Travis returned from his first meeting of the Council with Commissioner for Children and Young People (CCYP), Helen Connolly, and I was delighted to hear about the Council's work.

This year Travis' campaign group is focused on facilitating the discussion about lowering the local government election voting age from 18 to 16. Throughout the year, he will be working closely with students and local Members of Parliament to ensure that young people have a voice and can be heard.

Free Internet Access

During 2025 the Federal Government is offering an initiative to provide students free internet access until 2028 through the National Broadband Network (NBN).

Called the School Student Broadband Initiative (SSBI), the program aims to provide NBN's 50 download/20 upload speed tier and is available for up to 30,000 families who meet some criteria:

- Have a school aged student at home (full or part time), enrolled in an Australian school (up to Year 12 including Reception).
- Not have an active NBN network internet service at your current residential address now or in the past 14 days (having a mobile internet service does not affect eligibility).
- Live in a premise that can access the NBN network through a standard connection.

To check if you qualify and take advantage of the offer:

- Contact the National Referral Centre, on 1800 954 610 (Mon–Fri, 10am– 6pm AEDT), or by clicking <u>here.</u>
- Callback, webchat and interpreting services are also available.
- The National Referral Centre team will check your residential address and ask you some basic questions to determine if you qualify for the Initiative.

I remind the community that speed on the Shepherdson Road Driveway and throughout the school is 15km per hour. Cars overtaking stationary cars on the College two-way roads with oncoming cars from other direction does create a significant safety concern. Anything you can do to assist in caring for the safety of all in our community would be greatly appreciated.

Enrolment of Students

To assist with our medium and long-term planning I encourage parents to lodge an enrolment form with the school as soon as they have made a decision to enrol their child at the school. Year 7 Reflection Days

On Monday and Tuesday, April 7 and 8, the Year 7 cohort travelled to Penola and the Mount Burr Swamp for their Year 7 Reflection Days. Below is a snapshot of the days-

Today we went to Mount Burr Swamp. We learnt about the history of the swamp and how there is currently not much water there because of drought. We participated in three activities: GPS, Walking the Seasons and a Nature Reflection. We were given a GPS, coordinates and questions and learnt about the animal species native to the area. We walked the area with Uncle Doug, learning about the natural environment. We also had time being in nature and drawing the things we saw. My favourite part was the GPS Tracking because we were able to explore the space (and find lollies!). Also spending time talking with Uncle Doug and learning how to use the native resources around us, like using sticks to make fire.

Today we went to Penola and had Mass to begin the day to start off the experience. Following that, in groups, we went to Mary MacKillop Interpretive Centre, St Joseph Room, School House, Cameron House and Petticot Lane. We learnt about the Sisters of St Joseph, including what they wore, and about Mary MacKillop and how she began teaching and grew closer to God. In Petticoat Lane we explored the old houses and building. I was amazed by how small the houses were compared to houses today, with not much living space. Petticoat Lane was my favourite part of the day.

Thank you to Father Peter and the staff at the Mary MacKillop Interpretive Centre, the Glenelg Nature Trust and Landscape Board SA for the time and planning put into making this a meaningful experience for our students.

Holy Week

Holy Week begins this Sunday. Holy Week is the week before Easter Sunday. It begins on Palm Sunday and ends on Holy Saturday. Easter is not part of Holy Week, but rather the beginning of the Easter season of the Liturgical year.

On Palm Sunday, we celebrate the triumphant entry of Our Lord, Jesus Christ, into Jerusalem, riding a donkey. Later, when Jesus entered the Temple, he angrily drove out the money changers who had turned the Temple court into a place of business instead of devotion. Once the court was cleared, Jesus began teaching the masses.

The next major event in Holy Week is Holy Thursday. On this day, Jesus celebrated the Passover feast with the disciples. We know this feast as the Last Supper and the institution of the Eucharist. After supper, Jesus went to the Mount of Olives and prayed. Jesus was arrested on the night of Holy Thursday. The next day is Good Friday, and on this day, we commemorate the trial, punishment, and crucifixion of Our Lord.

Throughout this week, all classes have been involved in learning about and commemorating the significant events of Holy Week.

Easter

Easter is the greatest celebration in the Catholic church. The Easter season lasts for 50 days. At Easter we celebrate the 'Risen Christ' and reflect on how Easter is a time of new life and the importance of taking time to reflect on how we can make our life 'new'. As Easter falls in the school holidays, so we will reflect on Easter when students return to school.

Giving of Easter Eggs

Part of the tradition of Easter Sunday is the giving of eggs as a symbol of new life and joy. It is from Easter Sunday, that we enter the season of Easter with 50 days of joy and celebration until Pentecost. Students who do wish to share the joy of Easter with their friends or class mates are asked to refrain from doing so at school until after Easter.

Term 1 Masses in the College Chapel

Mass takes place every Thursday at 9:10 am in our school chapel, with a different year level preparing for and attending the Mass each week. We welcome family and community members to attend. The final Mass for this term is-Week 11: Thursday, April 10- 9:10am Year 6 Mass



YEAR 7 REFLECTION DAYS

On Monday and Tuesday, April 7 and 8, the Year 7 students travelled to Penola and the Mount Burr Swamp for their Year 7 Reflection Days. In Penola, the day began with Mass at St Joseph's Church. Students then visited the Mary MacKillop Interpretive Centre, the School House, Petticoat Lane and Stable Park, to focus on two of our College Founders. On returning to Mount Gambier, students visited St. Paul's Catholic Church, with a particular focus on the stained-glass windows.

A critical element to the Year 7 retreat is the immersive experience at Mount Burr Swamp. Students undertook 3 activities designed to strengthen their connection to Country and appreciation for our local landscapes. Jess from Nature Glenelg Trust, guided the students through a GPS scavenger hunt across the site that highlighted some of the unique species present within and surrounding the swamp. Uncle Doug and Mel from Landscape Board

Limestone Coast, conducted their enlightening 'Walking The Seasons' program, in which students learn to identify the unique characteristics of our Boandik seasonal calendar. Whilst Miss Brauer and Mr Raymond encouraged connection to nature through art, and some deep conversations surrounding biodiversity and seeking balance for our natural habitats, waterscapes, agriculture and industry for future generations. Students demonstrated remarkable reverence and engagement, listening deeply to Country and God's gift of creation.

Staff were very impressed with their enthusiasm for learning and the strengthened connections made with each other, the Founders, their parish and their environment.

GRIP LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE



Students saw firsthand how food scraps from our kitchens, canteen, Sugarloaf Cafe, and yard organics bins are transformed into nutrientrich soil enhancers that are used around our College. They discovered the creative process of repurposing bottle tops into new products like soap dishes, plant pots, and pens to be sold by our Poplars students, and in place of new materials to refurbish and create furniture. A highlight of the visit was a fun guessing challenge, where some students won a prize for correctly estimating that it takes 50 bottle tops to make a single soap dish! This hands-on experience showed them the power of recycling & sustainable resource management in our community.
