### Wellbeing and Engagement Collection Survey - Weeks 3 and 4

Students in our school will be invited to take part in a survey being conducted during Week 3 and 4 this term.

Young people's sense of wellbeing is an important part of how they learn at school. The purpose of the survey is to seek students' views about their wellbeing and their engagement with school. Students in year levels 4 to 12 across the state will be invited to participate in the Wellbeing and Engagement Collection. The information collected will help the education system and broader community to support young people's health and wellbeing.

The survey asks students about their social and emotional wellbeing; school relationships and engagement and learning in school; and physical health and wellbeing and after school activities. Students' answers will be kept confidential – no one (including school staff) will use the results to identify individual students.

Following Geraldine Hawkes' presentation on Hospitality and Dialogue, staff will reflect on what it means for The Tenison Way to Catholic Identity and Mission. ### Laudato Si Week (May 24-31) - 10 years of inspiration and action

10 years ago, Pope Francis wrote Laudato Si', setting out a bold vision for our common home. While we celebrate 10 years of prayer and action together, we look ahead to an even brighter future. The next chapter of Laudato Si' begins with us.

Laudato Si' underlines the need for personal and cultural transformation in the midst of our ecological and climate crises. Our commitment stems from the conviction that, even in times of ecological and climatic crises, each of us has the power to make a difference and contribute to building a more sustainable future.

Together, we can cultivate a world where harmony between humanity and nature is a tangible reality.

"there are no lasting changes without cultural changes ... and there are no cultural changes without personal changes" (Laudate Deum 70, 2023).

Laudato Si was a pivotal encyclical by Pope Francis calling Catholic's around the world to care for our common home, our planet. This encyclical provided the foundation for our College's focus on ecology and sustainability and has led to many whole school initiatives and curriculum integration over the past ten years.

Laudato Si has also reminded us to: "Let us sing as we go. May our struggles and our concern for this planet never take away the joy of our hope." (Laudato Si 244, 2015).

### Caring for One Another - Road Safety in PRC Carpark and Marist Park Area

I remind the community that the carpark adjacent to the Pam Ronan Centre is a senior student carpark and not a kiss and drop zone. Kiss and drop zone are on the driveways running alongside the PRC off White Avenue and in front of the Front Office area off Shepherdson Road. Adherence to this approach, as well as deliberate care in these areas will protect the safety of our young and avoid any unfortunate accident.

I also remind families of the importance to monitor their actions in the Marist Park area, which can be quite hazardous given the terrain and the less organised parking approach given the nature of the property. Please keep an eye out for one another as we enter and leave Marist Park.

### **Enrolment of Students**


















# Experimenting with Tie-Dye in Year 9 Project Runway






