

I trust these students will gain insights into the realities of life for our poorest neighboUrs of Timor-Leste in both village and urban contexts as well as to witness the work of the Church as it meets the material, pastoral and spiritual needs of the communities served by its presence. All money raised this year will be distributed to the communities that delegates will visit, such as the Bakhita Centre, the Dominican Orphanage and our sister school in Hatolia, San Francisco Xavier College. Through immersing themselves into the Timorese culture, students will embark on a transformative journey of learning and

self-discovery. They will witness the resilience and determination of the communities they visit, gaining a deep understanding of their challenges, but at the same time their appreciation of their precious gift of life. It is hoped that this experience will foster empathy, compassion and an appreciation for cultural diversity and will inspire our students to strive for a more just and inclusive world.

I look forward to hearing the stories of the delegation and their insights into how the funds raised by our community this year will be donated and put to good use to support our neighbouring sisters and brothers.

White Avenue Safety - Use the Koala Crossing

Families are finding the best place to pick up their children and if children cross White Avenue I ask them to cross at the Koala Crossing. Using the Koala CRossing offers some extra safety, as cars slow down to navigate the narrowed road. We continue to lobby for a more elaborate solution to traffic challenges on White Avenue, but at this stage, awareness, care, and use of the Koala Crossing is our best approach.

Parking on Aston Fields

It has been drawn to our attention that parents are using the student car park entrance and parking on the grassed areas of the Aston Fields. We ask that parents avoid these areas as this parking is causing a safety concern during lessons and immediately after school.

Year 9 Students Bring Art to Life with Dinner Plate Animations


Our Year 9 Animation students have completed an innovative term-long project that literally puts art on the table. The "Dinner Plate Animation" project challenged students to create custom animations specifically designed for projection onto dinner plates, transforming everyday dining into an immersive visual experience.

Working with industry-standard software including Adobe Photoshop and After Effects, students developed their artistic and technical skills from the ground up. They designed original graphics, mastered complex animation techniques, and explored advanced After Effects tools including composition layouts, precomp mini animations, and sophisticated transformation effects using scale, rotation, and opacity adjustments.

The dedication shown by our students was remarkable as they refined their graphics and incorporated special effects to create truly impressive animations. This unique project not only developed their digital media skills but also encouraged creative problem-solving as they considered how their animations would interact with the curved surface of dinner plates. The results showcase the incredible talent and hard work of our Animation students.
