Absence during Week 10 – World Congress on Positive Psychology in Brisbane

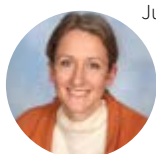

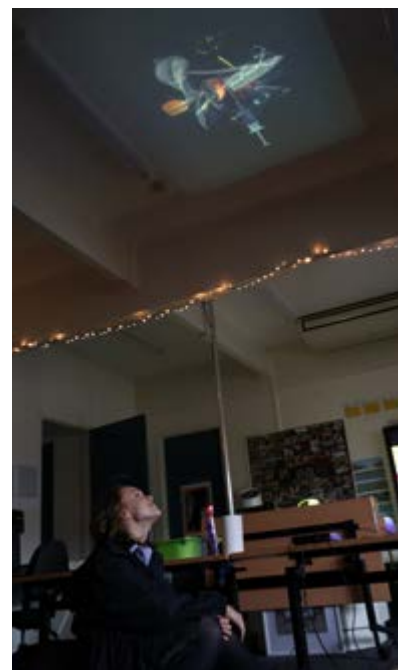

Stage 1 Creative Arts – Digital: Immersive Projection Installation

To conclude an incredible semester of exploration and creativity in Stage 1 Creative Arts – Digital, Molly Skenfield has developed a captivating final project that draws viewers into the haunting world of the Mysteries of the Night. This immersive projection artwork reimagines the eerie sensations of night terrors and insomniac hallucinations. By collaging distorted images of everyday indoor objects typically associated with the nighttime, the artist constructs a surreal, dreamlike atmosphere that unsettles and intrigues. Projected onto the ceiling and designed to be experienced while lying down, the work physically invites the viewer into a state of vulnerability and introspection. A disquieting audio track further heightens the sensory experience, blurring the lines between reality and illusion. This ambitious and thought-provoking installation is a powerful culmination of the student's growth and experimentation throughout the semester, demonstrating both technical skill and conceptual depth.

This is a fantastic opportunity for students to get a taste of the construction industry and get some hands-on experience.

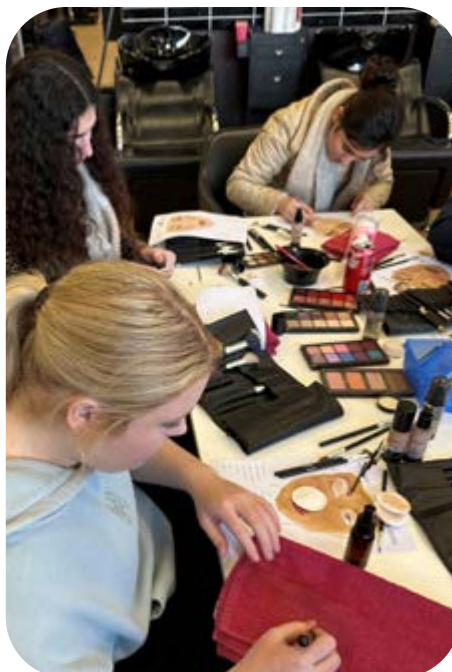
The following students completed the TAFE SA Try-A-Trade Hair and Beauty program yesterday at the TAFE Mount Gambier Campus.
